She was a soprano soloist at an Oakland synagogue for 16 years and a soloist in

One hobby that Corinne enjoyed was "Clowning." After attending a clown training camp she became a "caring clown "or "La La the Clown," visiting at Petaluma Valley Hospital, nursing homes, shut-ins, and Petaluma Senior Day Center with a puppet. She also led monthly singalongs for 15 years. She was also an avid reader, loved to paint, and used to make most of her gowns for singing.

She first attended Elim in 1990 and became a member of the choir. Corinne felt the presence and guidance of God in her life, and she felt blessed. She hopes to be remembered for her friendliness, her ability to cheer people up and make them smile.
