






# This is the community of "Maclovio Rojas" in Tijuana.




We are building a house for Graciela Gomez and her grown son Javier. Her 5 grandchildren visit everyday.

- a footing trench is dug










The frame of the house is wired with baling wire for stability.

first layer of stucco is applied


